About the Puyallup Tribe

Our Tribe:

In the old days, in our aboriginal language, we were known as the spuyaləpabš (Spoy-all-up-obsh), meaning “generous and welcoming behavior to all people (friends and strangers) who enter our lands.”

Today we are known as the Puyallup Tribe of Indians. Our people lived here for thousands of years existing by the bountiful gifts provided by the creator. Our Mother, Mount Tacoma, provided the water that supplied our salmon. We were fed by the abundance of nature’s gifts: Salmon, shellfish, wild game, roots and berries. The cedar trees provided our homes, utensils, clothing and transportation. All of these gifts are part of our rich cultural heritage we have today. Our environment was rich in the wealth of natural resources providing all our needs, allowing us to live healthy, happy lives. There were no worries of where the next meal would come from, no rents to pay. There was the freedom to practice our religion, train our children, and take care of our elders.
